### **Navidad Nuestra**

Composed by Ariel Ramirez, in 1964 in collaboration with Felix Luna, Navidad Nuestra is a folk drama of the nativity of Jesus Christ in the rhythms and traditions of Hispanic America. In this composition Ramírez gave to each episode of the story of the Nativity a distinctive regional voice that captures the mystery and glory of the birth of Christ in the musical idiom of the Composer's background.
