In addition to his choral involvements, Simon works extensively as a freelance accompanist.

Lisa Fraser is a graduate of the University of Queensland in Music Performance, having studied piano with Pamela Page and completed Postgraduate Education studies at Monash University and was based for a number of years at Ivanhoe Girls' Grammar in Melbourne. She has worked in several musical and educational fields including classroom music teaching, VCE music programmes, music education research, choral conducting workshops, vocal and instrumental accompaniment and has enjoyed repetiteur work for various school musicals. Lisa has previously been a member of The Melbourne Chorale, and accompanist for the West Gippsland Chorale, and is currently pursuing classical vocal technique and methodology with Kathryn Sadler in Melbourne.

Based in West Gippsland, Lisa is presently a tutor at St Paul's Anglican Grammar School in Warragul in addition to her home studio and continues to work as a freelance accompanist for concerts, exams and auditions for Melbourne and Monash Universities and various local competitions.
