## Lux Aurumque

After deciding upon the poem by Edwards Esch for the lyrics for this piece, Eric Whitacre had it translated into the Latin by the celebrated American poet Charles Anthony Silvestri.

## Dirait-on

Morten Lauridsen was so struck by Austrian-born Rainer Maria Rilke's French poems on roses that he decided to use the poems as the lyrics for his brilliant *Les Chansons des Roses*. The final piece, *Dirait-on*, was composed as a tuneful *chanson populaire*, or folksong, and is one of four of his pieces that have become all-time best-selling choral octavos.

Abandon surrounding abandon, tenderness touching tenderness... Your oneness endlessly caresses itself, so they say;

self-caressing through its own clear reflection. Thus you invent the theme of Narcissus fulfilled. English translation by Barbara and Frica Muhl Abandon entoure d'abandon, tendresse touchant aux tendresses... C'est ton interieur qui sans cesse se caresse, dirait-on;

se caresse en soi-meme, par son propre reflet eclaire. Ainsi tu inventes le theme du Narcisse exauce. Rainer Maria Rilke, from *Les Roses* 

## 0 Magnum Mysterium

For centuries, composers have been inspired by the beautiful *O magnum mysterium* text with its juxtaposition of the birth of the new-born King amongst the lowly animals and shepherds. This affirmation of God's grace to the meek and the adoration of the Blessed Virgin are celebrated in Morten Lauridsen's setting through a quiet song of profound inner joy.

O great mystery, and wondrous sacrament, that animals should see the newborn Lord, lying in their manger! Blessed is the Virgin whose womb was worthy to bear the Lord Jesus Christ, Alleluia! O magnum mysterium, et admirable sacramentum, ut animalia viderent Dominum natum, jacentum in praesepiio! Beata Virgo, cujus viscera meruerunt portare Dominum Christum, Alleluia!



## **WGC Musical Director**

Nathan Byrne

Nathan is employed by the Chorale, joining the West Gippsland Chorale as Musical Director in February 2022.

Nathan is an experienced choral, classroom, and instrumental music teacher, having worked across a variety of educational settings over the last decade. He has worked as a classroom music teacher, first at Traralgon College as a classroom music teacher and coordinator, and currently as the Head of Performing Arts - Events at St Paul's Anglican Grammar School.

After obtaining his Bachelor of Music from the University of Melbourne Conservatorium of Music under the tutelage of Dr Mark McGee, Nathan qualified with a Master of Teaching (Secondary) degree from The University of Melbourne.

Prior to classroom music teaching, Nathan was the Musical Director for the Apollo Health Music Society Choir at The University of Melbourne, Parkville. This choir was a mixed voice, unauditioned SATB choir to suit various ability levels. In this position he directed the choir through two major concerts a year, as well as minor performances at nursing homes and hospitals between 2009 and 2014. Since then, he has been heavily involved in community musical theatre as musical director, vocal coach and rehearsal pianist for Latrobe Theatre Company since 2015. Since 2017, Nathan has been the director for a school-based vocal ensemble as part of his role at St Paul's Anglican Grammar School.

Nathan is currently the secretary of the 2022 Australian National Choral Association (ANCA) committee, Vic-Tas branch, Vice-President of the Association of Music Educators VIC Inc. (aMuse), and General Committee Member of Australian Choral Conductors Education and Training Inc (ACCET).



## **WGC** Accompanist

Chris Sim

Chris is employed by the Chorale, joining the West Gippsland Chorale as accompanist in May 2019.

Chris has performed and taught both locally and in Melbourne for many years. She completed her formal music education at The University of Melbourne's Conservatorium of Music under the tutelage of Igor Machlak, Olga Kharitonova and Anna Goldsworthy.

Chris has been awarded both her Associate in Music Australia and Licentiate in Music Australia for piano, and, after obtaining her Bachelor of Music degree with Honours, qualified with a Master of Teaching (Secondary) degree from The University of Melbourne.

A recipient of the Janet Clarke Hall Scholarship, the Vera Moore Scholarship and the William Angliss Scholarship, Chris has held positions as both a non-resident and resident music tutor and official accompanist at University College, The University of Melbourne, as an instrumental and music theory teacher at the Parkville Music School, an orchestral pianist for the Australian Conservatoire of Ballet Orchestra, and as classroom, ensemble and instrumental teacher for a number of metropolitan and regionally based schools.

Chris continues to teach music theory and piano privately in Gippsland, while performing as an accompanist for both chamber and solo engagements, in eisteddfods, exams and musicals.





## Solo Pianist

Hugo started playing the piano when he was 5, and has now been learning for 8 years. He is studying with Deanna Tabensky and enjoys learning according to the Suzuki method.

Hugo is enamoured with the fact that keyboard instruments can play many different melodies and chords concurrently. He is particularly interested in the music of film score composers and hopes to become a professional film composer himself. He is a member of the St Paul's Academy of Music and has recently joined the Warragul Municipal Band. Hugo is currently preparing for his Grade 6 AMEB Piano examination.

Starting piano in 2016, Hanting Huang is now studying the piano with Mikhail Solovei as his piano teacher and will reach his sixth year of learning the instrument around August 2022.

Hanting loves music written in the classical, romantic, and baroque eras, and also enjoys some composers of the contemporary style. He loves being able to project his feelings and emotions into his music and letting it speak for him, as does he enjoy simply listening to the beautiful melodies it can create.

In the past, Hanting has received several awards for his music, his most recent one being first place in the MSV audition/competition. One of the most influential prizes he has obtained in his career as a musician was the first place he received when he was 9 years old, as it was a turning point to how he and his family saw his musical abilities.


